

**Recreation Center Shutdown** – The Recreation Authority will be conducting its yearly shutdown from **Saturday, August 19 – Monday, September 4, 2023.** There will be no programs or rentals available during this time. The Main Office will be open from 8:30am-4:00pm Monday-Friday to assist guests. During the week of August 28 – September 1 the office will be open by appointment ONLY. Appointments can be made by emailing recauthority@rare-mi.org.

Cancellations or Changes to Programs/Facilities – The Recreation Authority of Roseville & Eastpointe may need to make modifications or cancellations at any point to programs. This includes building closures due to maintenance, inclement weather, staff shortages, etc. The Recreation Authority will make notifications about cancellations to program participants or facility renters as soon as possible. #### **Program Policies**

Policies are available at the Recreation Authority and on our website rare-mi.org

Program Payment: Fees are due at time of registration.

**Program Registration:** A parent/guardian or grandparent must register anyone under the age of 18 years old. Special Events and Trips are an exception.

**Registration Deadline:** Sometimes programs are cancelled because patrons wait too long to register. Most programs, unless otherwise noted, will have a registration deadline of two business days prior to the program start date (example: if the program is scheduled to start on a Friday, registration deadline will be on Wednesday. Monday program start dates will have a registration deadline of the prior Thursday). Please register early to avoid disappointment.

**Late Registration Policy:** Registration may be taken after the deadline, if in fact, the program has reached their minimum and there is space available. Waiting to register until the deadline does not guarantee you a spot in the program; the program may already be full. Registrations accepted after the deadline will be assessed a \$5 late fee.

Recreation Authority Program Cancellation: The Recreation Authority of Roseville & Eastpointe reserves the right to cancel any class or program and a full refund will be processed. Online or Credit/Debit registration refunds will be less the additional processing fee. Classes or programs will be cancelled prior to the day of class in order to give registered participants adequate notice. However, if a class is scheduled to start on a Monday, notice will be given on the prior Friday. If a program is cancelled after a program has started, a refund will be issued based on the number of classes that are missed. If a program's time and dates are altered by the Recreation Authority after the program has started and you are no longer able to attend the program due to the change, it is the responsibility of the household to contact the Recreation Authority within seven business days (Monday-Friday) following the notification of the program change to receive a prorated refund.

Individual Cancellations: Should a participant need to cancel out of a class or program a \$5 processing fee will be held and a refund or credit will be issued based on time of refund request. Any refund for a class must be requested before the 2nd session of the registered class. Full refunds minus a \$5 processing fee will only be available before the second class or prior to class starting. NO REFUNDS will be given after the 2nd class has started. Online or Credit/Debit registrations will be less the processing fee paid at the time of registration on top of the department processing fee. Sports league refunds will have an additional uniform fee processed, this uniform is yours and will be available for pick up once it is sorted by the Recreation Authority Center. If any class or activity includes a uniform or materials fee, this fee will not be refunded. Refunds will not be given for special events unless it is determined by the Recreation Authority.

**Refund Return:** A refund check will be processed and mailed 3-4 weeks following the request for the refund.

#### **Rental Policies**

Policies are available at the Recreation Authority and on our website rare-mi.org

Room Security Deposit: A \$100 deposit is required for Rooms 1, 2, & 3; a \$200 deposit is required for the Activity Center and Multi-Purpose Rooms; a \$100 deposit is due for the Birthday Party Package

**Non-Refundable Deposit:** A deposit of \$50 is required on top of the security deposit for all room rentals. A deposit of \$20 is required for all gymnasium rentals. These deposits are non-refundable and go towards your rental balance.

**Birthday Party Package:** Includes a 5-hour rental in Room 2 and a 2-hour rental in the gymnasium. Bounce houses or petting farms are NOT permitted for rentals. No food in the gymnasium.

Pavilion Rentals: Rental fee is due in full at the time of booking. Cancellations must be made at least 5 business days in advance; a \$20 service fee will be held for all pavilion rental cancellations.

**Rental Request Deadline:** If a rental is requested less than 10 business days from the event date, the rental time must be within the pre-scheduled time for the building or park staff hours of that day. No pavilion rentals may be booked if there is not a pre-determined staff scheduled for that park on the requested date. Rentals booked less than 10 business days from the reservation date will be assessed a \$25.00 surcharge.

Cancellation Policy: Room reservations must be cancelled at least 5 business days (Monday-Friday) in advance to receive a refund of their security deposit. Gymnasium and pavilion rentals must be cancelled at least 5 business days (Monday-Friday) in advance in order to receive a refund. Refunds may take 3-4 weeks to process and will be mailed to the contact address directly. Cancellations of less than 5 business days (Monday-Friday) in advance will not be issued a refund. Reservation date may be rescheduled, at no additional charge, pending availability. Rescheduling a date must be done at least 3 business days prior to the current reservation date.

Remaining Balance for Room/Gymnasium Rentals: The balance must be paid 10 business days (Monday-Friday) prior to rental. If the rental fee is not paid 10 business days (Monday-Friday) in advance, a \$25 late fee will be assessed. If the balance is paid 10 business days (Monday-Friday) or less – the payment must be in cash, money order, or credit/debit – no personal checks will be accepted.

Items/Services not permitted at Recreation Authority Center: Professional decorators, event planners, DJ's/Bands, bounce houses, petting farms, alcohol, candles (live flame) and table confetti/glitter/hay are NOT permitted in any room.

**Park Alcohol Policy:** Alcohol is NOT allowed in Roseville parks. Beer & wine is allowed in Eastpointe parks. Glass is not permitted in any park at any time.

**Entertainment Policy:** Additional entertainment that requires liability insurance, such as bounce houses/inflatables, petting farms, pony rides, trains, dunk tanks, gaming trucks, concession items and tent/table/chairs are NOT permitted for rentals. Entertainers such as clowns, magicians, face painters or characters ARE permitted for rentals. A notice of entertainers is appreciated, but not required.

**Day of Event:** Responsible Party (contract holder) must be on site for the entire rental, the room/gym or pavilion will not be available until renter arrives.

**Additional Contract Holder:** One additional contract holder may be added to a reservation contract. A request form must be filled out and submitted to the Recreation Authority Main Office Staff prior to the additional persons being added. The fee to add an additional contract holder is \$25 per rental.

Security Deposit Return for Room Rentals: Deposit will be refunded and mailed 3-4 weeks following the rental date, provided the condition of the room does not require additional maintenance, renter does not exceed rental period and contract requirements are adhered to. If renter contract requirements are not adhered to, amount withheld from the deposit is made by the discretion of the Recreation Authority.

#### RENTAL INFORMATION

All room, gym and pavilion rentals must be reserved in person during the Main Office hours (Monday-Friday, 8:30am-4:00pm). For any other rates, information, or policies contact the Main Office Monday – Friday, 8:30am-4:00pm or visit our website: rare-mi.org. Renter MUST stay on site for the entire rental.

Room and gymnasium reservations between the months of February – August can be made the second Monday in January; reservations between the months of September – January can be made the second Monday in August. Pavilion reservations can be made the first Monday in April.

#### INFLATABLE/ENTERTAINMENT POLICY FOR RECREATION AUTHORITY CENTER & PAVILION RENTALS

Additional entertainment such as bounce houses/inflatables, petting farms, pony rides, trains, dunk tanks, gaming trucks, concession items and tent/table/chairs are NOT permitted for rentals. Entertainers such as clowns, magicians, face painters or character ARE permitted for rentals. A notice of entertainers is appreciated, but not required.

#### **Room Rentals**

Food and beverage services must comply with local, county and state regulations. No alcohol, smoking, DJ's/Bands, candles, confetti/glitter/hay, event planners or professional decorators are permitted in the Recreation Authority Center. Room deposits are required at the time of reservation. Security deposit is refundable and will be returned following the rental; refunds may take 3-4 weeks to process and will be mailed to the contract holder directly. Room Rentals are for a 5-hour block of time; this includes set-up and cleanup. Birthday Party Package includes 5 hours in Room 2 and 2 hours in the gymnasium. Non-Residents add \$50 to rental fees listed.

#### **Gym Rentals**

Spectators, food and dunking are **NOT** permitted in the large gym or small gym at any time. Gym rentals are for basketball only unless approved otherwise. Rentals are for a 2-hour block of time. Non-Residents add \$30 to rental fees listed.

#### **Pavilion Rentals**

The rental season for park pavilions is from the Saturday prior to Memorial Day through Labor Day. Weekday (Monday – Friday) rental hours are 4:00-8:00pm; weekend/holiday (Saturday, Sunday or Holiday) rental hours are 11:00am-8:00pm. Park permits are done on a first come, first serve basis. DJ's, bands, glass, ground fires, fireworks, oil fryers, marijuana and vehicles are not permitted on park grounds. Beer and wine is permitted in Eastpointe parks, liquor is not permitted. Alcohol of any kind is NOT permitted in Roseville parks. Parks with electricity have an asterisk (\*). Non-Residents add \$25 to rental fees listed.





Eastpointe's real estate market continues to favor sellers with rising sale prices and strong demand despite increases in interest rates and home prices. The over 25% increase in inventory does, however, mean sellers need to be more careful in their pricing. The higher inventory also is encouraging for those who want to buy.

<sup>1</sup> Days on Market (DOM) below 60 is a market that favors sellers; above 90 days is a market the favors buyers.

The absorption Rate is the rate of home sales derived by dividing the number of sales by the inventory (number of homes at the beginning of the month plus new listings during the month).

Above 18.3% is considered a seller's market. Below 15.4% is considered a buyer's market.

In a seller's market inventory (number of homes at the beginning of the month plus new listings during the month) increases create buyer opportunity and have little if any negative impact on percent of asking price or Days on Market (DOM). Decreased inventory reduces inventory and constrains sales. The reverse is true in a buyer's market.

The information above reflects the complex nature of the real estate market. Sale prices in both markets have declined modestly, but with the average home selling for full price, there is no "discounting" of prices because of higher interest rates. In fact, it has generally been accepted that the current rate environment is likely where rates will remain for some time. The decline in the number of sales also is an indication the initial decline in sales we saw in late 2022 and into early 2023 as buyers adjusted to these higher rates. It is expected that the next report will show an increase in average sale price, although the number of sales will likey still be lower, but only because of insufficient inventory.

Days on Market, while increased for both cities, are actually of little concern, as the length of time to sell remains roughly half of what is seen in a balanced market and will have no real impact on the market. Additionally, while the absorption rate has declined in both markets; both markets continue to favor sellers, just not as much as it did last year.

Finally, with the increase in inventory in Roseville and as buyers become normalized to the current rate environment, the next report may show improvement. In Eastpointe, until inventory shows a similar uptick, it is likely sales will remain constrained.
