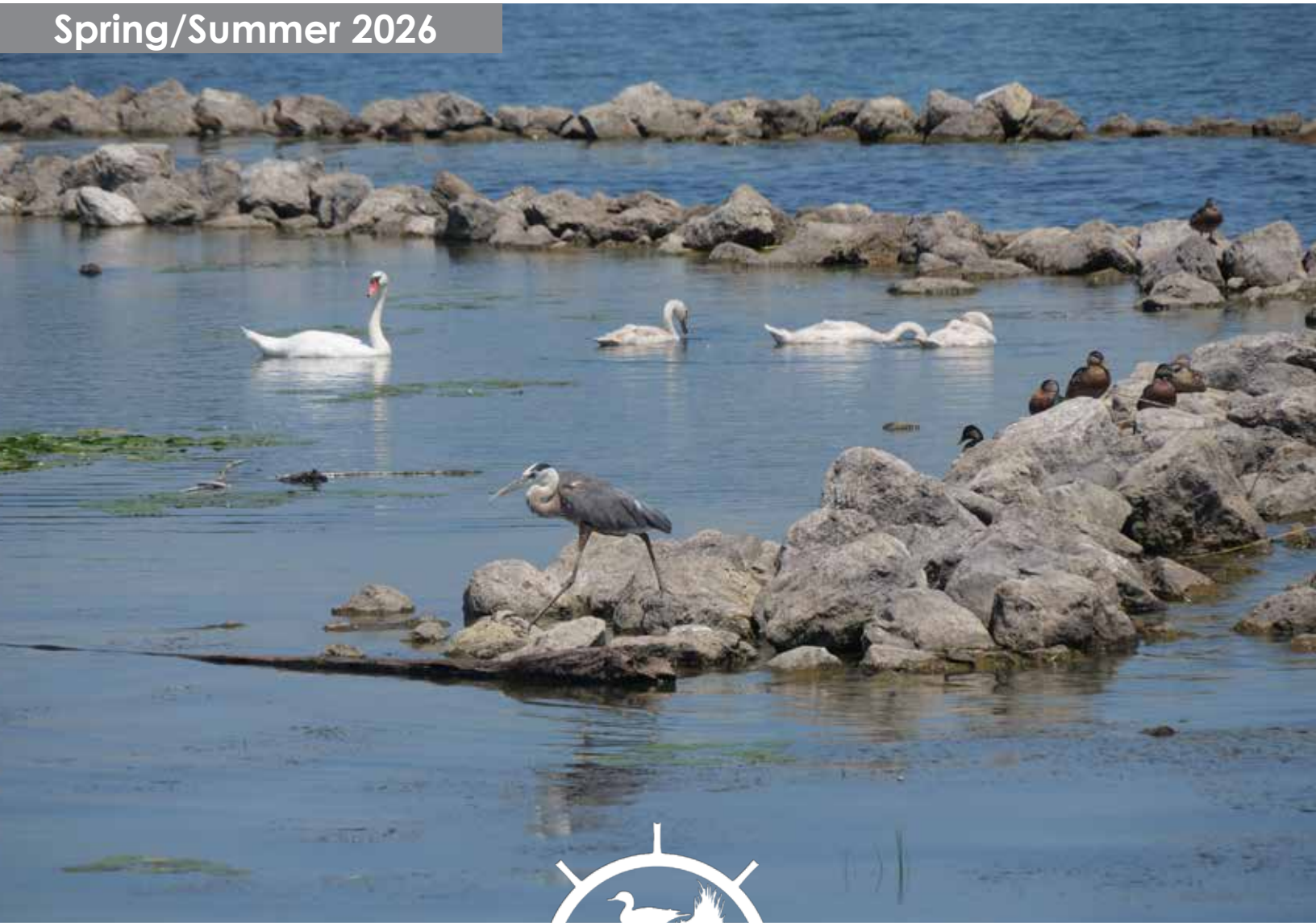

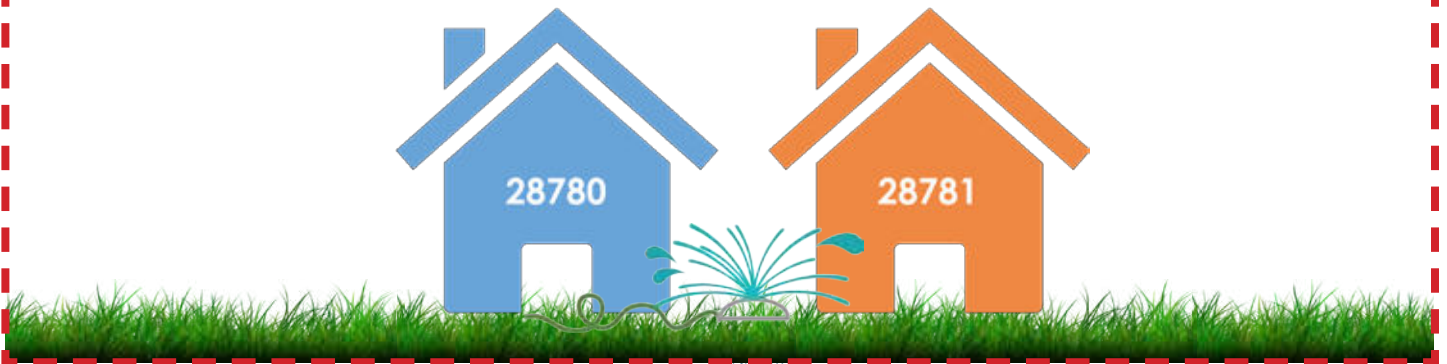


Mandatory Odd/Even Sprinkling Restriction

A mandatory odd/even sprinkling restriction runs from Memorial Day to Labor Day each year. **Designated hours for all sprinkler systems is from 12:00 A.M. to 5:00 A.M.**

Addresses that end in an **EVEN** number: Water lawns on **EVEN** calendar days

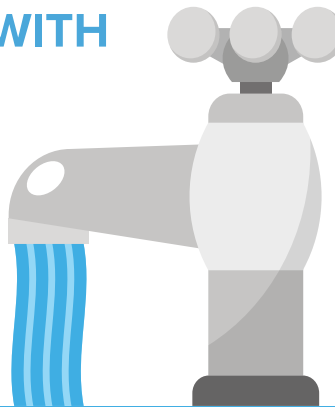
Addresses that end in an **ODD** number: Water lawns on **ODD** calendar days



NEED ASSISTANCE WITH YOUR WATER BILL?

WRAP CAN HELP!

The Water Residential Assistance Program provides funding to eligible, low-income households. Funding is provided by the Great Lakes Water Authority and is administered in partnership with local community action agencies.



WRAP can help reduce your water bill and pay past due balances!

WRAP Eligibility:

- Reside within an eligible GLWA Member Community (see reverse side for list)
- Responsible for paying your water bill
- At or below 200% of the federal poverty level
- Own or rent your home

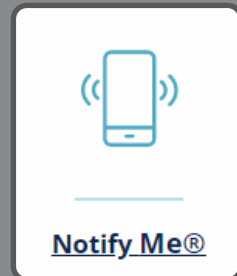

Did You Know???

“Flushable” wipes should **never** be flushed!

Aside from causing large problems with municipal sewer systems, wipes and other items also cause problems in the pipes inside your home. Clogged pipes can lead to overflowing toilets, basement sewer backups and the need to clean out the main drain. When this happens, a plumber is needed to clear the blockage. **To help avoid these problems and expenses, only flush human waste and toilet paper.**

Here is a list of other items that should **never** be flushed:

- Personal and baby wipes
- Cotton balls and swabs
- Tampons
- Cat litter
- Sanitary products
- Prescription drugs
- Condoms
- Over-the-counter medicines
- Facial tissues
- Cigarette butts
- Paper towels
- Cooking fats, oils, or grease
- Cleaning wipes and rags
- Dental floss

STICK TO THE 3 Ps

Only three things go in your toilet: pee, poo and (toilet) paper! If you really want to use wipes, throw them in the garbage, not your toilet.



Macomb County Spotlight

Department of Roads

The Macomb County Department of Roads (MCDR) is responsible for the maintenance and management of Township roadways, bridges, culverts, and traffic signals, including advanced traffic signal systems, traffic cameras, and signs.

Drain Commission

Macomb County Drain Commission is responsible for the management and upkeep of county drains, the Macomb Interceptor Drain, and co-manager of the Oakland-Macomb Interceptor Drain, they manage a system of pipes and pumps that provide sewer services to more than 1 million people. Other major duties include administration of the Soil Erosion Control Act, review of subdivision plats and management of the Chapaton and Martin retention basins.

Are You Registered to Vote?

There are several ways to register to vote.
Here are a few:

- **Email:** Email your completed Voter Registration Application to election@chesterfieldtwp.org.
- **Municipal Offices:** Head over to the Clerk's Office at 47275 Sugarbush, Chesterfield, MI 48047 where you'll fill paperwork out in person.
- **Online @ <https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us/registervoter>:** Use the MI Voter Information Center's web page to register to vote online.

Looking to Vote Absentee?

Per Michigan law, all voters can now vote absentee. Follow the steps below:

- **Step 1: Obtain an absentee ballot application** Visit or call the Clerk's Office at 47275 Sugarbush, Chesterfield, MI 48047 or (586) 949-0400, opt. 5. You may also be able to download one at michigan.gov/vote.
- **Step 2: Complete it, sign it, and submit it to the Clerk's Office.** Completed applications can be dropped off at the Clerk's Office or in the drop-box at 47275 Sugarbush, Chesterfield, MI 48047, mailed to the same address, or emailed to election@chesterfieldtwp.org
- **Step 3: Upon receipt, a ballot will be mailed to the address indicated on your application.**

Summer Taxes

Summer and/or School Taxes are due July 1, and payable July 1 - September 14 without interest. These tax bills include 50% of the Anchor Bay and New Haven school taxes, 100% of the L'Anse Creuse school taxes, County Operating taxes, Macomb Intermediate school taxes, and Macomb Community College taxes.

August 2026 Parks & Recreation Millage Proposal

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

1 MILL annually, if approved by voters.

1 MILL = 1/1000 OF A DOLLAR, OR \$.001 CENTS

If a millage rate is 1 mill, a resident is taxed .001 cents for every dollar, or \$1 per \$1,000 of the taxable value of the property.

EXAMPLE: A home with \$100,000 taxable value would pay \$100 per year. This example would cost the homeowner \$8.33 per month in additional levied taxes.

HOW MUCH WILL IT GENERATE?



In its first year, the millage is expected to generate approximately \$2.5 million to support the proposed improvements.

IF APPROVED, WHAT WILL WE GET?

If a Parks and Recreation Millage (1 Mil for 10 years) is approved in August 2026, the residents of Chesterfield Township can expect to see the following:

- ✓ A gymnasium and indoor walking track added to the **Community Center**
- ✓ **Pollard Park** baseball diamond and soccer field revitalization
- ✓ **Community Center** facility modernization
- ✓ **Pickleball courts, dog park, playground, walking path, pocket neighborhood parks, trails**
- ✓ Residents will have the opportunity to share insight, ideas, and feedback.

Prior to April 7, Chesterfield Township will be implementing our new registration software, CivicRec. This platform is easier to navigate for customers and staff, and will allow a quicker streamlined registration process. We listened to your feedback and we are excited to make this change.

How should I prepare?

Our Spring/Summer season will be the first to use this new software. We encourage you to create your new account now so you're ready for registration day. Our team is here to help make the transition as smooth and easy as possible.

Will my account switch over?

No, information will not transfer from our previous system. This will help eliminate duplicate profiles, outdated addresses, and other old information. This provides a fresh start with the new system

We encourage you to attend a public training session where staff can help you set up your new account.

Do I have to register online?

We also accept registration in person at the Community Center during open hours. This new CivicRec system is much easier to navigate, so if you were hesitant before, we encourage you to give it a try.

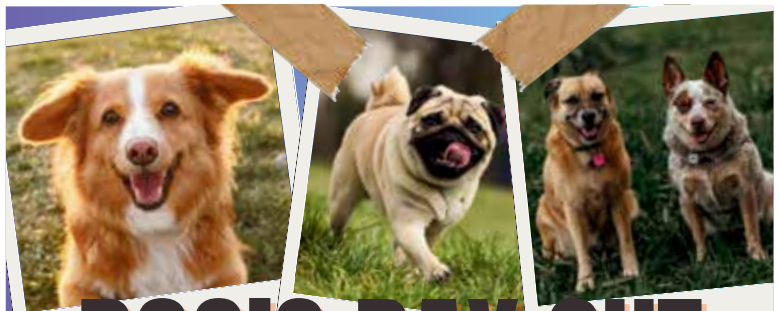

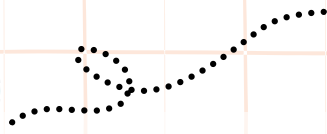

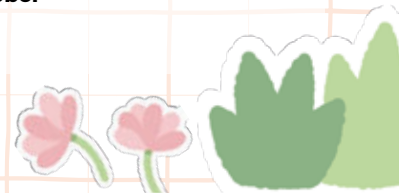
Nature's Notebook

As a sub-recipient of SMART funding Chesterfield Township contracts services through Richmond Lenox Community Transit to provide our senior and disabled residents cost-free, door-to-door, round-trip transportation service to grocery stores, banks, work, pharmacies, day trips, medical appointments, procedures and more.



REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Pre-registration is required for all activities in the Senior Center and offered through the Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department. Registrations are accepted, in-person, at the Chesterfield Community Center - 48400 Sugarbush Road, Chesterfield Township, MI 48047. Cash, check, credit card or money order is accepted for walk-in payments. The customer will incur a service fee for credit card transactions. Enrollment can be done for most classes and activities by visiting our website at parks.chesterfieldtwp.org. Click the "REGISTER NOW" tab on the left side of the screen. Follow the prompts using your email address for login to the registration system. Facility reservations and select programs are not available online. Call the Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department at 586-949-0400 ext. 4 for further information. There is a free-standing Drop Box located in the front circle drive at the Township Municipal Offices for after-hour enrollment. To register by mail or drop-box, enclose a check made payable to Chesterfield Township along with the appropriate registration form. The Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department is unable to prorate fees due to late registration or partial attendance. It is the responsibility of the participant to update their phone, email, and address to receive the most current information.

REFUND POLICY

The Chesterfield Township Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department will consider refunds for programs and sports leagues under the following circumstances.

1. If a program is canceled by the Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department, the participant will receive a full refund.
2. Refunds cannot be processed for one-time programs, bus trips, ticket sales or special events.
3. For programs meeting three times or less, refunds requests must be made prior to the first meeting.
4. For programs meeting four times or more a refund will be considered prior to the second scheduled program meeting. A refund request will be accepted and reviewed by submitting a Refund Request Form. A processing fee of \$5.00 or 10% of the program base price will be assessed to all approved refunds. Additionally, any cost incurred by the Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department (uniforms, tickets, apparel, food, supplies, equipment, contractual expenses, etc.) will be assessed against the fee to determine the refund. Refunds will not be processed after the second scheduled program meeting.
5. Refunds for in-person registrations will be issued by check from the Finance Department. Please allow approximately 3 to 4 weeks for checks to be issued. Refunds for online registration transactions will be returned to the credit card used for purchase.
6. Refunds to payments issued by check require a 10-day waiting period prior to processing.
7. Transaction/Convenience Fees for payments made by credit card (in-person or online) are non-refundable.
8. In-house credits are not available. If a transfer to another program is requested, the participant will be fully refunded and charged separately for the full fees of the newly requested program.
9. All participant-initiated refund requests should be made in-writing and submitted to Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Management for approval. Written documentation of the refund request is required to protect the department and the requestor.
10. All refund requests are subject to review by Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services employees and the Treasurer's Office.
11. Chesterfield Township Department of Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services reserves the right to review these procedures and administer refunds in the best interest of the participants and by generally approved accounting procedures.

ACTIVITY CANCELLATIONS

Chesterfield Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services reserves the right to cancel an activity or program because of a lack of enrollment or other circumstances beyond its control. If a cancellation is necessary, enrollees will be contacted by phone or email, and a full refund will be processed.

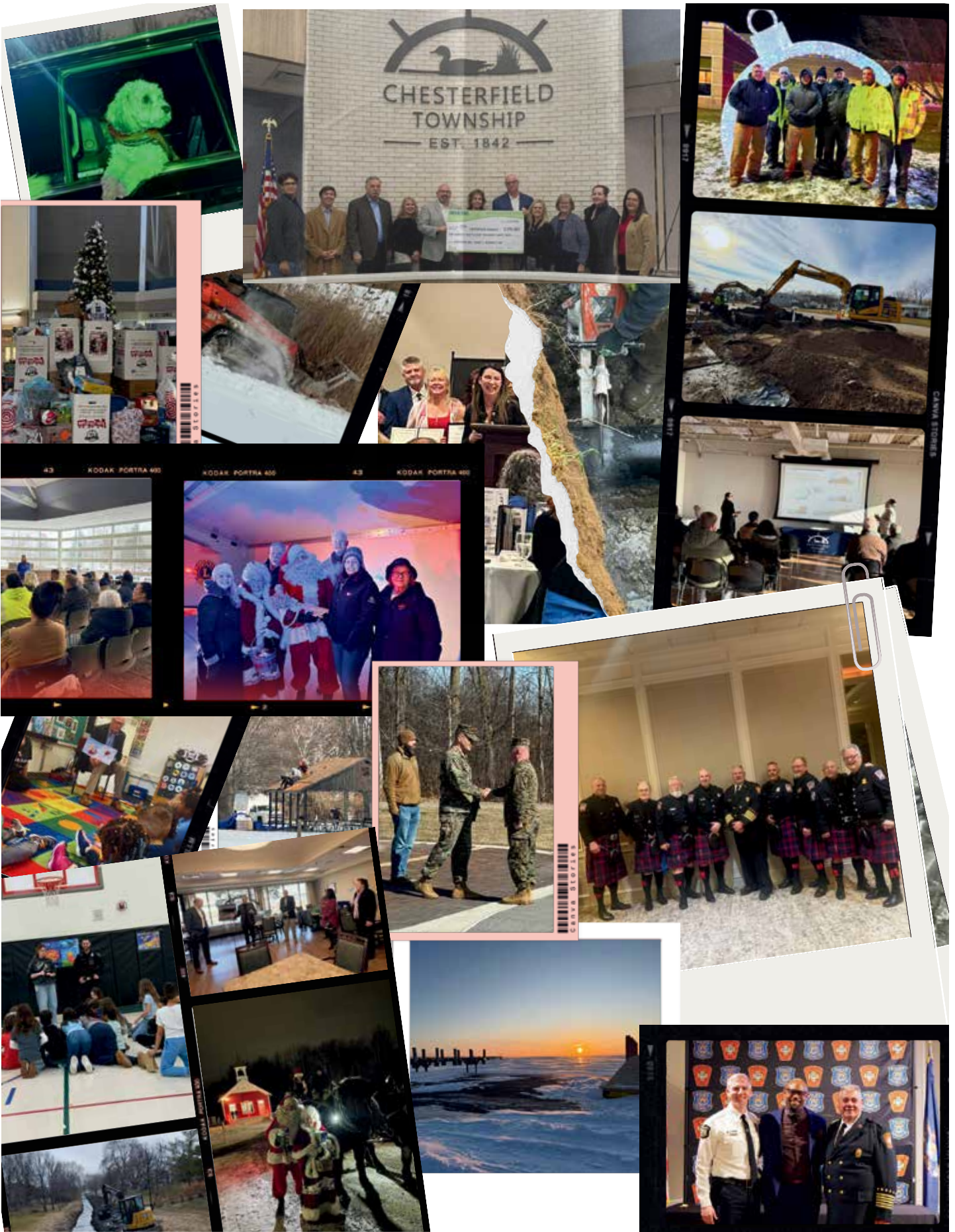

Princess Clara Ward

In the 1890s, Clara Ward was the name on everyone's lips.

The daughter of Michigan's first millionaire, newspapers called Clara, "As beautiful as she is rich." At just 17-years-old, she married a Belgian prince and became royalty. Seemingly, she had it all. But in 1896, Clara shocked the world. She ran off with a penniless fiddler named Rigo in the dead of night, trading royalty for freedom and liberation.

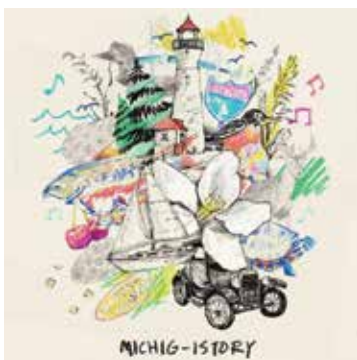
From this point on, she was headlining everything from newspapers to Moulin Rouge. She performed cabaret nearly nude. She posed

provocatively for postcard photos that were sold (and eventually banned) across Europe. She married 4 times. Psychologists deemed her a nymphomaniac, and said she should be thrown in a ward.



Clara scandalized the world until her untimely death at 43. But despite a lifetime of gossip, Clara is remembered today as exactly the kind of woman she set out to be—an unusual one.

An American Dream Growing in Strawberry Fields Forever



Strawberry Fields has been a staple of the Chesterfield community since 1979. As a long-established, Beatles-themed restaurant with a welcoming family atmosphere, the locale is certainly well-known. However, the story of its current owner really brings into perspective the significance of what a small business and its community can mean.

Rita Shahoud emigrated from Syria to the United States in 2013 after winning a Diversity Visa. With her two boys, Elie and Antony, Rita came to the US ahead of her husband, Bassam Issi, who later joined them all after retiring as the general manager of a Toyota dealership. After encouragement from a friend, Bassam and Rita invested into buying Strawberry Fields in 2018, with Bassam leading the charge. The restaurant continued to flourish.



However, tragedy struck when Bassam passed away from pancreatic cancer in 2022, leaving Rita—an engineer by trade—to fully take over the restaurant. Compounding the challenge, Rita was diagnosed with breast cancer shortly afterwards.

As Rita expressed, "I didn't know what to do or where to even start." But with a powerful sense of religious faith and exceptional medical treatment, Rita overcame her breast cancer; as a quick learner, she took charge of becoming a restaurant operator and learning the business inside and out. Strawberry Fields has continued

to service Chesterfield without skipping a beat, and Rita credits this to the restaurant's wonderful staff as well. She added, "They were with me wholeheartedly, every step of the way. And I can't get rid of them even if I try!"

Strawberry Fields remains popular, especially for its breakfast. In the restaurant, Rita finds incredible fulfillment in the families who patronize it and have made her part of the community. She notes, "It feels like the perfect example of the American Dream, and a continuing memory of Bassam." While The Beatles' "Strawberry Fields Forever" is the restaurant's namesake, Rita's favorite Beatles song is actually "Let it Be": "And when the night is cloudy, there is still a light that shines on me. Shinin' until tomorrow, let it be."

Average Sale Price – Still Climbing: The market’s average sale price just can’t stop going up—even with more homes for sale and affordability challenges lurking in the background.
