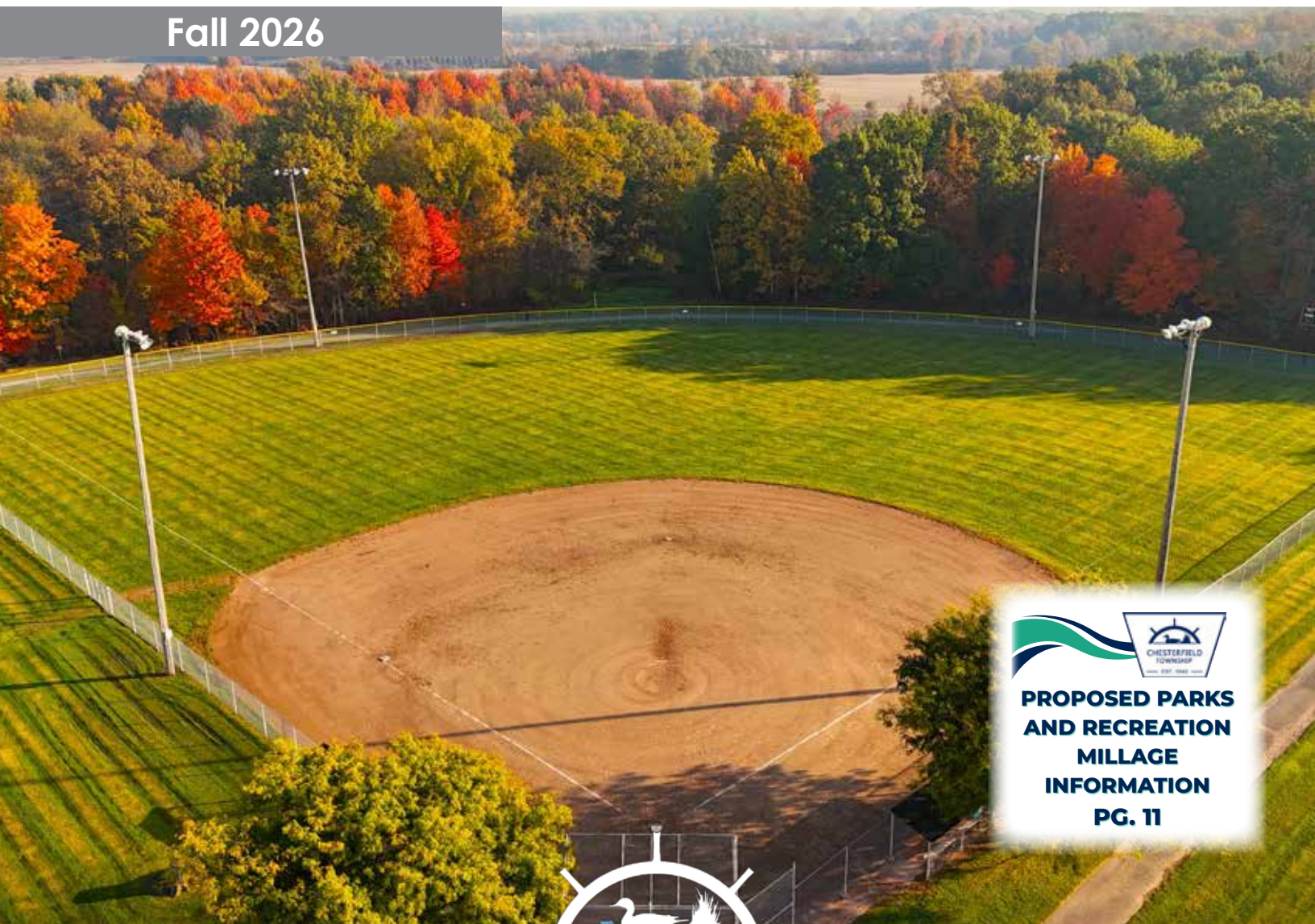

Ditch Maintenance & Phragmites

Phragmites are the primary invasive species target of Chesterfield Township. Phragmites create a major hindrance to our waterways: Reducing flow capacity to many of our drains, reducing visibility of the beautiful views of our lakes and streams, and limiting access for recreation by choking off our drains and streams. Phragmites are also limiting visibility along roadways, making unsafe conditions for drivers. Flooding and cutting in combination with multi-year herbicide applications can control Phragmites.

What can be done to control Phragmites?

- **Prevention:** Use clean equipment, free of the potential seeds which take root and expand quickly
- **Early Detection:** Know how to identify this invasive species
- **Rapid Response:** Begin mitigation the first season they are found

The best method of controlling Phragmites without the use of chemicals and herbicides is to drown the plant by the repeated cutting of stems below the waterline. It is best to cut it when the phragmites reach four feet or more above the waterline, and by cutting the stems as low as possible below the waterline.

The best method of controlling Phragmites without flooding, is achieved with a multi-year plan of cutting in combination with herbicide and surfactant applied Mid-August through September.

When is the best time to cut?

- November through May
- Not within the first two weeks following a herbicide treatment
- If cutting with riding equipment the best time to cut to avoid soil disturbance is when the ground is frozen, late January.

What do I do with the cuttings?

- Roll down and leave in place
- Mow down and leave in place
- Mow down and remove from the site in bulk
- Hand cut and bag them for removal with trash
- Hand cut and bag the heads only and remove with trash

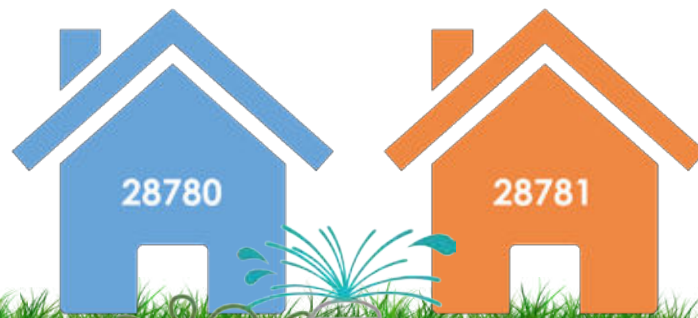
Mandatory Odd/Even Sprinkling Restriction

A mandatory odd/even sprinkling restriction runs from Memorial Day to Labor Day each year.

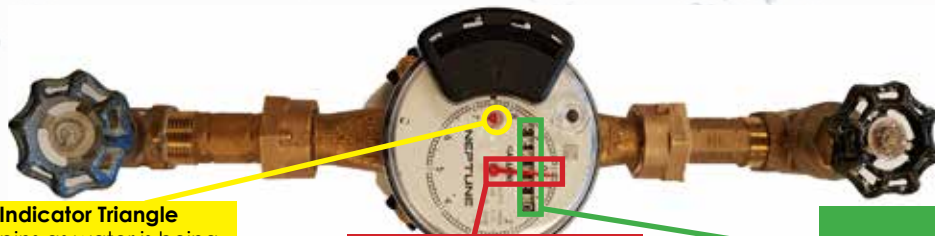
Designated hours for all sprinkler systems is from 12:00 A.M. to 5:00 A.M.

Addresses that end in an **EVEN number: Water lawns on **EVEN** calendar days**

Addresses that end in an **ODD number: Water lawns on **ODD** calendar days**



At Home Leak Detection



Flow Indicator Triangle

This dial spins as water is being used. When a leak is small, it is hard to see the sweep hand move, so this dial helps residents to see small leaks.

Sweep Hand

This hand moves clockwise as water is being used. One full revolution equates to 10 gallons of water usage.

Register

This is the numerical gauge that counts the amount of gallons of water used. It works just like the odometer in a car.

Option 1: Before going to bed, ensure all water using appliances are not running. Write down the numbers on your water meter register. Immediately after waking up, before any water usage, write those numbers down again. If the number has increased, a leak is present.

Option 2: Mark the location of the water meter sweep arm with a piece of tape or another sticky item that will stay in place. Write down the numbers on your register. With all water using appliances off, check your meter periodically to see if the sweep hand moves. If so, a leak is present.

Are You Registered to Vote?

Looking to Vote Absentee?

Per Michigan law, all voters can now vote absentee. Follow the steps below:

- **Step 2: Complete it, sign it, and submit it to the Clerk's Office.** Completed applications can be dropped off at the Clerk's Office or in the drop-box at 47275 Sugarbush, Chesterfield, MI 48047, mailed to the same address, or emailed to election@chesterfieldtwp.org
- **Step 3: Upon receipt, a ballot will be mailed to the address indicated on your application.**

August 4, 2026 Parks & Recreation Millage Proposal

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

1 MILL annually,
if approved by voters.

1 MILL = 1/1000 OF A DOLLAR, OR \$.001 CENTS

If a millage rate is 1 mill, a resident is taxed .001 cents for every dollar, or \$1 per \$1,000 of the taxable value of the property.

EXAMPLE: A home with \$100,000 taxable value would pay \$100 per year. This example would cost the homeowner \$8.33 per month in additional levied taxes.

HOW MUCH WILL IT GENERATE?



In its first year, the millage is expected to generate approximately \$2.5 million to support the proposed improvements.

IF APPROVED, WHAT WILL WE GET?

If a Parks and Recreation Millage (1 Mil for 10 years) is approved in August 2026, the residents of Chesterfield Township can expect to see the following:

- ✓ A gymnasium and indoor walking track added to the **Community Center**
- ✓ **Pollard Park** baseball diamond and soccer field revitalization
- ✓ **Pickleball courts, dog park, playground, walking path, pocket neighborhood parks, trails**
- ✓ **Community Center** facility modernization

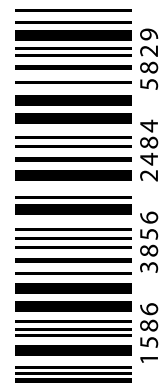

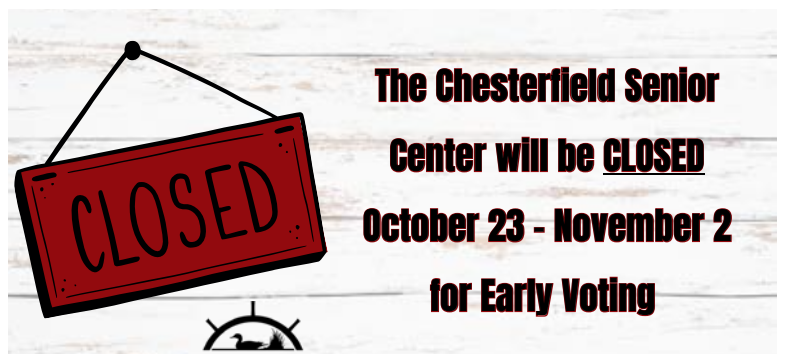

As a sub-recipient of SMART funding Chesterfield Township contracts services through Richmond Lenox Community Transit to provide our senior and disabled residents cost-free, door-to-door, round-trip transportation service to grocery stores, banks, work, pharmacies, day trips, medical appointments, procedures and more.



REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Pre-registration is required for all activities in the Senior Center and offered through the Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department. Registrations are accepted, in-person, at the Chesterfield Township Municipal Offices, 47275 Sugarbush (N. of 21 Mile, S. of Cotton.) Cash, check, credit card or money order is accepted for walk-in payments. The customer will incur a service fee for credit card transactions. Enrollment can be done for most classes and activities by visiting our website at parks.chesterfieldtwp.org. Click the "REGISTER NOW" tab on the left side of the screen. Follow the prompts using your email address for login to the registration system. Facility reservations and select programs are not available online. Call the Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department at 586-949-0400 ext. 4 for further information. There is a free-standing Drop Box located in the front circle drive at the Township Municipal Offices for after-hour enrollment. To register by mail or drop-box, enclose a check made payable to Chesterfield Township along with the appropriate registration form. The Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department is unable to prorate fees due to late registration or partial attendance. It is the responsibility of the participant to update their phone, email, and address to receive the most current information.

REFUND POLICY

The Chesterfield Township Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department will consider refunds for programs and sports leagues under the following circumstances.

1. If a program is canceled by the Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department, the participant will receive a full refund.
2. Refunds cannot be processed for one-time programs, bus trips, ticket sales or special events.
3. For programs meeting three times or less, refunds requests must be made prior to the first meeting.
4. For programs meeting four times or more a refund will be considered prior to the second scheduled program meeting. A refund request will be accepted and reviewed by submitting a Refund Request Form. A processing fee of \$5.00 or 10% of the program base price will be assessed to all approved refunds. Additionally, any cost incurred by the Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Department (uniforms, tickets, apparel, food, supplies, equipment, contractual expenses, etc.) will be assessed against the fee to determine the refund. Refunds will not be processed after the second scheduled program meeting.
5. Refunds for in-person registrations will be issued by check from the Finance Department. Please allow approximately 3 to 4 weeks for checks to be issued. Refunds for online registration transactions will be returned to the credit card used for purchase.
6. Refunds to payments issued by check require a 10-day waiting period prior to processing.
7. Transaction/Convenience Fees for payments made by credit card (in-person or online) are non-refundable.
8. In-house credits are not available. If a transfer to another program is requested, the participant will be fully refunded and charged separately for the full fees of the newly requested program.
9. All participant-initiated refund requests should be made in-writing and submitted to Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Management for approval. Written documentation of the refund request is required to protect the department and the requestor.
10. All refund requests are subject to review by Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services employees and the Treasurer's Office.
11. Chesterfield Township Department of Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services reserves the right to review these procedures and administer refunds in the best interest of the participants and by generally approved accounting procedures.

ACTIVITY CANCELLATIONS

Chesterfield Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services reserves the right to cancel an activity or program because of a lack of enrollment or other circumstances beyond its control. If a cancellation is necessary, enrollees will be contacted by phone or email, and a full refund will be processed.

FAN FACE ADDICTION NOW

Formerly Families Against Narcotics

Face Addiction Now (FAN) has launched a free mobile hepatitis C testing and treatment program, funded through a Hepatitis C Elimination Initiative Pilot from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

Staffed by a nurse practitioner, registered nurse, and community health workers, the initiative is designed to remove barriers such as transportation challenges, insurance access, and stigma—especially for underserved populations.

Hepatitis C is now highly curable, with treatment using oral pills effective in more than 95% of cases.

Piracy on the Great Lakes

At the turn of the 20th century, an infamous pirate known as Roaring Dan Seavey ruled the Great Lakes.

Sailing aboard his ship *The Wanderer*, Seavey was known for stealing ships, selling illegal goods, holding brothels aboard his vessel, and fighting men to the death in saloons.

Perhaps his most famous crime involved the hijacking of the *Nellie Johnson* schooner in 1908.



After docking his boat in Grand Haven, Michigan, Seavey and his crew boarded the *Nellie Johnson* with a keg of whiskey, and a plan.

For the next few hours, Seavey got the *Nellie* crew drunk beyond their wits, all while staying sober himself.

And then, when the moment was right, he threw the drunken crew of the *Nellie Johnson* overboard. Seavey set the *Nellie's* sails to Chicago, where he would sell all its valuable cargo for profit.

Three weeks later he was finally arrested, but to the surprise of historians, he walked free. Did he bribe the jury? Did he intimidate the witnesses? No one quite knows for sure.

The market in Chesterfield Township remains strong with continued low sales as the result of low inventory. This trend does appear to be reversing as the year-over-year figures suggest. Please note that with small amounts of data, average sale price is likely to fluctuate, noticeably, and is a less reliable indicator than Days on Market.

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UNDERSTANDING THE NUMBERS

Average Sale Price – As Expected: After climbing steadily throughout last year, prices appear to be taking a brief breather—a fairly typical pattern in markets where new construction is prevalent and builders are wrapping up their fiscal year. It also aligns with the broader market data, including fewer closed sales and a lower absorption rate, suggesting the market is pausing to catch its breath rather than changing direction.

Number of Sales – Holding Steady: Q1 typically brings a noticeable reset from the brisk pace of Q4, especially in markets where new construction plays a major role. Even so, year-over-year sales gains suggest buyer interest in the area remains solid. In short, the market may have eased off the accelerator a bit, but demand is still very much on the road.

Days on Market (DOM) – Still Looking Good: Days on market remain in a relatively tight range and continue to sit well below the more traditional 72-day average. While the pace is not quite the blink-and-it's-gone speed many remember from the most frenzied stretch of the market, homes are still moving at a healthy clip.

Inventory – Gradually Improving: Inventory is up slightly, and while the increase is modest, any additional supply is a welcome development—provided it does not weaken pricing. So far, the absorption rate suggests that has not been the case. Sellers still hold the advantage, but buyers at least have a few more options on the shelf.

Absorption Rate – Moving Toward Balance: At 25.6%, the absorption rate remains below the 30% threshold, giving buyers a bit more room to negotiate while still leaving sellers in a favorable position. With only a slight year-over-year change, the market is not exactly rewriting the rules, but it is becoming a little more even-handed. In practical terms, both buyers and sellers will need to come to the table prepared and realistic.

An absorption rate between 15.4% and 18.3% is considered a market in balance. Higher favors sellers, lower favors buyers.

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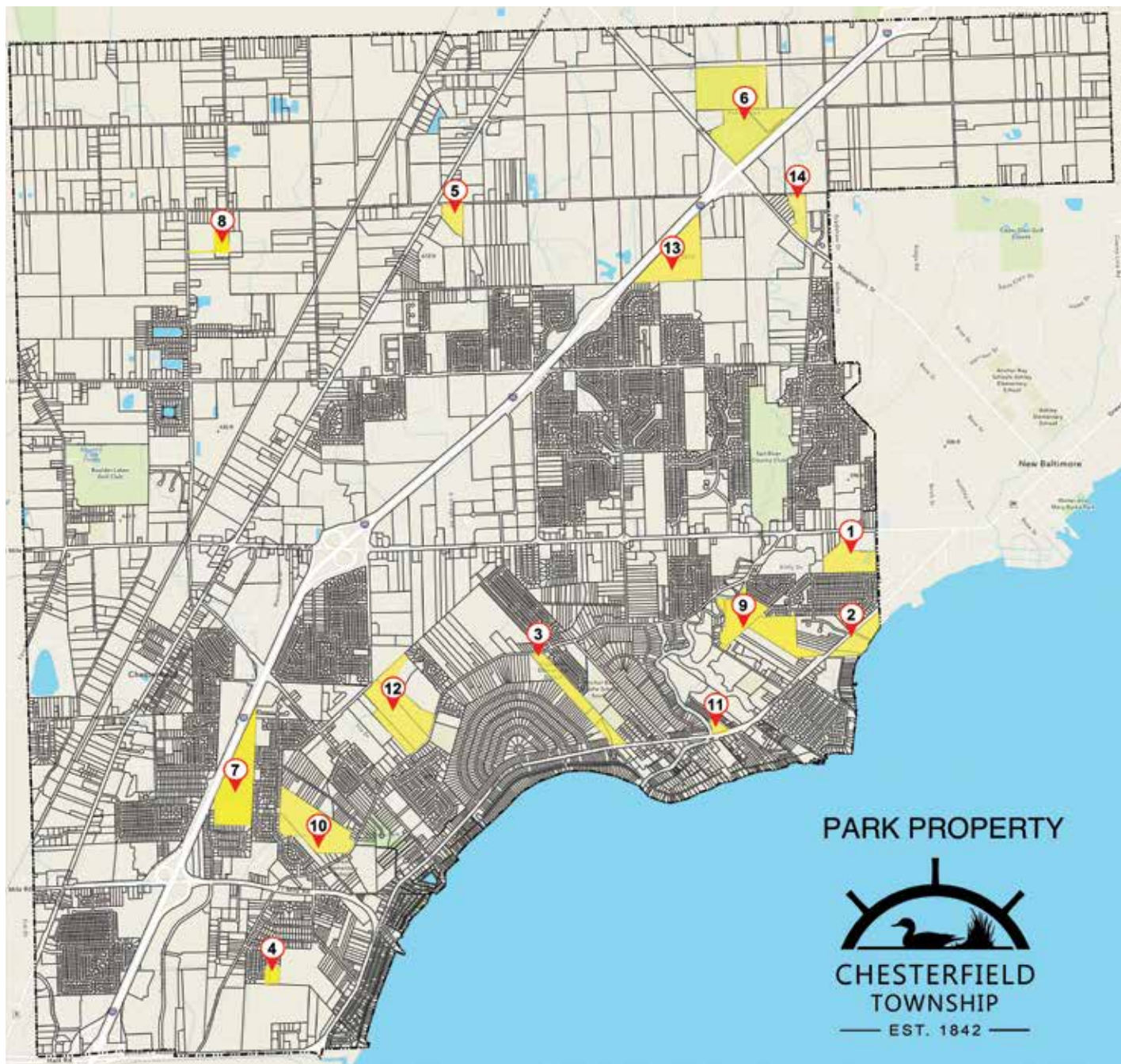

Chesterfield Twp is in the process of bringing our community closer together by increasing access for township residents by creating a network of parks, walking paths and nature trails. Residents will soon be able to access the Jefferson walking path. This will allow citizens to travel by bike or on foot all the way to New Baltimore from the new Chesterfield Twp community center located in the old Sugarbush elementary school building south of the Sugarbush and Callens intersection.
